On December 17, 2022, the Genl George Rogers Clark Chapter of ILSSAR conducted our annual Wreaths Across America ceremony at the Glen Carbon Village Cemetery, Glen Carbon, Illinois, at 11 am in accordance with the WAA Ceremonies across our country. This cemetery has a "Dough Boy" Statue, which is an indication that the cemetery has World War I veterans interred, there are two veterans from Glen Carbon who joined the Army together and were killed on the same day.

Phil Bailey, the GGRC WAA Chairman conducted the ceremony reading eighty veterans' Name, Rank, Service, Date of Birth & Death, and a bell was tolled for each name, while members of the Pin Oak 4H Club placed the wreaths. At this event Ellen Henschen sang the National Anthem and My Country `Tis of Thee. Taps was played by Cate Dorsey of the 4H Club. In attendance were thirty-five citizens, seven members of GGRC Chapter, and Erica Hariss, Illinois State Senator elect. The weather was clear, however with winds of over 20 mph, the wind chill was in the teens!
